Grounded in Gratitude

Because we are abundantly blessed by God with the gifts of time, talent and treasure, we will:

1. Encourage people to recognize their God-given gifts and discern ways to use them.
 - a. Expand the equipping model of ministry and spiritual growth into all aspects of congregational life.
 - b. Provide educational opportunities for individuals and teams.
 - c. Open personal conversations with new and current members to uncover where they feel holy and alive.
 - d. Foster a spirit of gratitude and thankfulness for all those who share their gifts in our church, community and world.
2. Create and implement plans to meet both long and short term needs for utilizing all CFC properties as places of spiritual growth.
 - a. Create and follow a maintenance schedule for all properties, prioritized and coordinated with the annual budget.
 - b. Create and prioritize plans for proposed future changes and/or additions.
 - c. Be mindful regarding upkeep of our properties by making the most environmentally friendly choices possible.
3. Create and implement faithful financial management plans to meet long and short term needs.
 - a. Create and follow an annual operating budget.
 - b. Create and prioritize a long range projection of future changes.
 - c. Consider a capital campaign to meet needs identified in long range plans.
4. Periodically review and update our spirit-guided governance to support our initiatives and open us to the Holy Spirit.



Spiritually Alive

Because we wish to be a conduit of God’s love, a wellspring of spiritual growth, and a sanctuary for Holy worship, we will:

1. Manifest the living God in our worship.
 - a. Explore music, storytelling, dramatic arts, media, and visual arts to make worship creative and relevant.
 - b. Include classical, traditional, contemporary, choral, ensemble, folk, world and secular musical offerings.
 - c. Break bread at Dinner Church, an evening worship service held around the table.
2. Practice Sabbath.
 - a. Encourage, respect and honor the rhythms of service and rest.
 - b. Explore ways to share what we are doing to celebrate Sabbath.
 - c. Explore creating a meditation garden and labyrinth.
3. Welcome children, youth and adults of all ages as an integral part of our community.
 - a. Provide Confirmation classes, Our Whole Lives faith and sexuality program, and Church School.
 - b. Encourage children, youth and adults to lead and participate in our worship and in all aspects of church life.
4. Deepen our journey with God, Christ and the Holy Spirit.
 - a. Pray for one another.
 - b. Offer Bible Study and small group opportunities.
 - c. Preach scripture-based sermons and design worship that lead us into deeper understanding of social issues.
 - d. Practice peace and forgiveness through prayer, reflection and confession, for example, the ritual of making peace cranes.
 - e. Reflect on our Epiphany Stars as a means of discovery and ownership of one’s spiritual call.



Beloved Community

Because we seek to be a joyful and compassionate community, where people are welcomed to live authentically and with integrity, we will:

1. Covenant to love one another, assuming the best of each other.
2. Practice hospitality as we work to expand our welcome, and celebrate our diversity.
 - a. Explore the Open and Affirming (UCC) and Reconciling (UMC) process.
 - b. Redesign our website to include information from all aspects of our church life and expand our social media outreach.
 - c. Develop specific points of contact for our members, newcomers and the community.
3. Create opportunities for people to come together to know one another more deeply, have fun together, and act as a community that extends beyond the walls of our building.
4. Care for one another.
 - a. Support one another with prayers, meals, cards, and other tangible acts of love through the Deacons, Called to Care, Stephen Ministry, and individual actions.
 - b. Explore lend-a-hand group opportunities within the church and community.
 - c. Form an Emergency Readiness Team, coordinated with the Fire Department.
 - d. Offer educational opportunities such as CPR training, hospice care, addiction awareness/support.
5. Select the appropriate pastoral and support staff to best meet our needs and support our staff with a nurturing and comfortable working environment.
 - a. Maintain up-to-date competitive personnel practices.
 - b. Determine ideal size, number and types of worship services offered.
 - c. Support the pastor in taking time for Sabbath.

Christ's Hands

Because we strive to be Christ's living hands in the Church, the community, and the world, we will:

1. Embody God's love through mission.
 - a. Encourage new missions as people feel called by God.
 - b. Affirm existing mission programs such Feeding the 5000 project, Holiday Baskets, and care packages for college students and military personnel.
 - c. Conduct periodic “drives”, i.e. diapers, coats, school supplies, canned goods, blood drives, and rummage sales.
 - d. Explore partnering with national/international organizations to extend mission beyond our local community, through mission trips and special giving.
2. Embody God's love through social justice.
 - a. Dismantle institutional racism, beginning with Sacred Conversations on Race.
 - b. Advocate for the rights of the marginalized.
 - c. Address cycles of poverty and homelessness, with sustainable and systematic change.
 - d. Support recovery from addiction.
3. Partner with community groups to be a responsible and responsive part of our local community. Our partners in Cotuit Village include:
 - a. The Cotuit Library
 - b. Cotuit Fire Rescue Department
 - c. Cotuit Civic Association
 - d. Cotuit Kettleers
 - e. Boy Scouts
 - f. Cahoon Museum
4. Partner with community service agencies as we live out Christ's call to minister to the least, the lost, and the lonely. We partner with:
 - a. The Cape Cod Council of Churches
 - i. Homeless not Hopeless, especially the Elise House
 - ii. A Baby Center
 - b. Habitat for Humanity
 - c. Miracle Kitchen
 - d. Faith Neighborhood Kitchen
