Dear Beloved Community,

In an interview on *Johnny Carson*, Carl Sagan said, "The whole idea of what happens when you read a book, I find absolutely stunning. Here's some product of a tree, little black squiggles on it. You open it up, and inside your head is the voice of someone speaking, who may have been dead 3,000 years, and there he is talking directly to you. What a magical thing that is."

Our Bible Study group experienced this over the last year. We traveled through Genesis, Exodus, Luke and Acts. We explored the Call of Abraham and Sarah, walked through the Red Sea with Moses and Miriam, ran to the manger with the shepherds, found the risen Jesus on the road to Emmaus, and sailed with Paul to share the gospel message. The story of God has been brought close and made new.

The joy of reading can transport us across time and experience. We can become an orphan girl living on Prince Edwards Island, a young wizard learning to fly on a broom; or we can move through an old wardrobe into a magical world.

I remember as a girl reading long into the night, book and light under my covers, reading books that I could not put down, reading until 3 in the morning, unable to stop until the story was complete.

Our next worship series will be "Storybook Summer." We will return to or discover anew stories written for children or youth. We will pair these timeless stories next to our ancient scriptures and allow them to illumine one another. We hope that it will awaken in us a childlike joy and wonder. Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs."

These stories and our ancient story of faith will have this interact to illumine our lived experience. Enclosed you will find the outline of our books. We hope that you will read along. Some are storybooks that you will hear in their entirety during worship, and from others, we will read an excerpt during worship. We hope that these simple stories will help us connect with timeless truths. Happy reading!

July 21 – *The Lion, The Witch, and the Wardrobe* by C.S. Lewis

Four adventurous siblings—Peter, Susan, Edmund, and Lucy Pevensie—step through a wardrobe door and into the land of Narnia, a land frozen in eternal winter and enslaved by the power of the White Witch. But when almost all hope is lost, the return of the Great Lion, Aslan, signals a great change . . . and a great sacrifice.

July 28 – *Winnie the Pooh* by A.A. Milne
