Sharing our home with friends makes me realize again what an amazing place it is that we call home.

A great joy was sharing the worship leadership with these friends that I have known for decades and have literally grown up with, both as a person and a person of faith. Our shared history makes us deeper friends and better followers of Christ. In many ways, we have practiced being church together across the globe.

I am thinking of how true this is for our congregation, as people travel back to Chicago or California or Florida or China or New York or Boston or the multiple places that our congregation spend their winter months or their work weeks. Although at times we are far-flung, still we are held together with the bond of faith and love. We pray for one another across the distances, and our varied perspectives and experiences expand our understanding of who God is and how God moves in the world.

Last year, we studied Genesis, Exodus, Luke and Acts in our bible study. I have been thinking about Acts especially, how Jesus' parting words to his disciples were, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." This passage is so true for our congregation.

We travel out with the word of God to the far corners, and then we gather back weekly, and for some seasonally, to worship our God and find hope in the scripture, and travel out with a faith that defies barriers of difference. Thanks be to God.

"They wanted to win for this community," Roberts said postgame. "They loved Cotuit, they loved going





BIBLE STUDY


Tuesdays at 6:30pm in Bruce Hall September 24—November 5



Denominations from evangelical to mainline continue to experience deep divisions over universal social issues. The underlying debate isn't about a particular social issue, but instead it is about how we understand the nature of scripture and how we should interpret it. The world's bestselling, most-read, and most-loved book is also one of the most confusing. In *Making Sense of the Bible*, Adam Hamilton, one of the country's leading pastors and Christian authors, addresses the hot-button issues that plague the church and cultural debate, and answers many of the questions frequently asked by Christians and non-Christians alike.

Did God really command Moses to put gay people to death? Did Jesus really teach that everyone who is not a Christian will be assigned to hell? Why would Paul command women to "keep silent in the church?" Were Adam and Eve real people? Is the book of Revelation really about the end times? Who decided which books made it into the scriptures and why? Is the Bible ever wrong? In

approachable and inviting language, Hamilton addresses these often misunderstood biblical themes, leading readers to a deeper appreciation of the Bible so that we might hear God speak through it and find its words to be life-changing and life-giving.



CFC Little Lending Library







Last Spring, Jack Gardner began working with our children to make one of Pastor Angie's dreams come true — *The Cotuit Federated Church Little Lending Library.* She started to imagine what kinds of books we might offer if the church had a Little Lending Library, just like the one at the town library. Several years ago, Lori Famigliette brought in several boxes of spiritual and religious books from an estate sale, and so Jack took on the task of designing the library. He created a design that looked just like our church and got to work, always imagining and planning ways to engage our children. They painted. They hammered. They did some tiny shingling, and they dug the hole that would hold the post that would hold the library that they helped to build under Jack's ever-encouraging guidance, and on May 18, the entire congregation blessed *The Cotuit Federated Church Little Lending Library.* The Pastor's favorite moment of that blessing is when one child asked where the rainbow staircase was. We will be sure to express that everyone in our neighborhood is welcome here through the gospel message that we will share through our new book ministry.

Building Expansion Project

Addressing Our Greatest Needs

CFC is a vibrant church where people experience being in beloved community. Our congregation and its role in the community is growing because our ethos is warm, inclusive, affirming, and relational. We strive to meet peoples' physical, spiritual, mental, and emotional needs, and is dedicated to supporting Cotuit and the broader Cape Cod community. As we have grown over the past several years, so, too, have our needs. Today, our greatest needs revolve around the size and quality of our physical spaces, which are far too small and outdated to effectively serve our congregation and community. It has been over 60 years since CFC last addressed its need for additional space. To meet the current and future needs of this congregation and community, we believe it is time to take action and address several deficiencies.

Our Current Situation

Overcrowded sanctuary with insufficient space for worship, funerals, and memorial services Small and outdated community hall that cannot host large groups and community events Outdated Sunday School rooms in the basement that lack windows and proper lighting Nursery room located in the basement, too far removed from parents

A crowded kitchen and insufficient office and administrative space

Limited and non-ADA compliant restrooms and no handicap access to the basement classrooms or nursery Lack of sufficient storage space throughout the church

Lack of facilities and emergency generator to provide shelter for the community when needed

Expansion Plan Benefits

A new Community Building that is ADA accessible, equipped with a commercial kitchen, audio/visual capabilities, and is double the size of our current gathering space

Showers and a generator to allow the new Community Building to serve as an emergency shelter

An expanded sanctuary that allows for larger worship services, weddings, and funerals. Visitors have missed funerals and memorial services due to limited capacity

Installation of assistive technology in the sanctuary to accommodate those with hearing loss

Updated classrooms and nursery room moved from the basement to the main floor for a safer and healthier environment Additional storage and upgraded administrative space that will allow CFC to continue to grow in ministry and service

Expansion Plan Next Steps

We will review the results of a Capital Campaign Feasibility Study conducted by CCS Fundraising, a respected consulting firm with a proven track record in studying and conducting successful faith-based and secular capital campaigns. We will modify our vision for expansion based on the feedback we receive from the study, and at an appropriate time, we will start a Capital Fundraising campaign. We believe that the expansion and renovation of our building will address our major space and usage issues and will ensure we can properly and sustainably serve our beloved Cape Cod communities.
