looking forward to when more volunteers will be able to safely help. As a church we continue to support this mission with funding, a volunteer and with prayers for those in our community who depend on this program for a warm meal, extra food and the most important ingredient, love.

Equipping Ministry and Growth Team

Equipping brings a Vision of growth and enthusiasm to our church. We envision a tree of support that encourages and equips each of us to bring our individual selves to the whole. In doing so, we not only each grow in the Holy Spirit, but we also bring that spirit and vitality outward to our church and the greater community. We encourage brainstorming, saying 'yes!' to new ideas, and assuming the best of one another.

Our team's specific ministry is to know and appreciate the people in the congregation and connect them with possibilities that reflect their spiritual gifts. We try to foster the idea of "bottom up" rather than "top down" governance. As a visual, we created the tree that hangs in Bruce Hall, where teams and officers are the roots, the support rather than an overseeing hierarchy. In order to know the congregation better, we have recently revised and simplified The Gifts We Bring survey and will have these available for the Stewardship program next fall. We will examine the best ways to utilize these surveys so that they each tell a story and can be appreciated in whatever way feels most meaningful to the writer.

We also realize that bottom-up governance can be a bit more scattered than conventional top down governance, so we created The Ministry Support Network – connecting each of the individual ministries to a particular team if they ever feel the need for some support or conversation. These connections are color-coded on the tree in Bruce Hall.

We can always do more – and often brainstorm and formulate projects that will help to create the atmosphere of an organic community. We are fortunate to have Pastor Angie who graciously encourages personal growth in each of us in all sorts of ways. Our team recently read The Organic Community by Joseph R. Myers. Myers encourages collaboration – allowing a spirit of diversity, individuality, creativity and wholeness to emerge. Digging around and planting in that soil is the source of God's unexpected wonder and surprises. BUILDING EXPANSION TEAM

The **Building Expansion Team (BET)** has started 2021 with significant progress and we are very excited to report what we have accomplished to date and what plans we have in the next couple of months.

Accomplishments Since November 2020

The Building Design team had several meetings with Conserv, our architecture, engineering, and construction firm that we hired last September. The results of these meeting has produced architectural renderings that we reviewed with the BET members in January. We are very pleased with Conserv's designs and projected costs, which align with our current fundraising, space needs and design goals in mind.

I am pleased to share that we have already raised \$2.5 million of the estimated \$3.5 million we will need to make this project a reality. I am truly grateful to the 74 members of our church and community who have participated thus far.

Based on the architect's renderings, Peter Rohner has redesigned his 3-D model, which you will see below. This is a wonderful presentation of the exterior of the church, the adjoining renovated space and the new Fellowship Hall.

Starting the first week of February, a series of Zoom meetings were conducted with the church teams — Administration, Deacons, Equipping, Pastor-Parish, Stewardship and Worship. The purpose of the meetings was to update the team members on the status of the building plans and the capital campaign, receive their guidance and answer questions based on the information we had at the time.

Next Steps Through March 2021

A meeting with the congregation is scheduled for **Sunday**, **February 28**, right after church services. The Zoom meeting will be similar to the presentations conducted with the church teams. At that time, you will have the opportunity to view the updated 3-D model and the architect's renderings and ask your questions.

About the season of Lent

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday emphasizes a dual encounter: we confront our own mortality and confess our sin before God within the community of faith. The form and content of the service focus on the dual themes of sin and death in the light of God's redeeming love in Jesus Christ.

The use of ashes as a sign of mortality and repentance has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship, and the Imposition of Ashes can be a powerful nonverbal and experiential way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation. This practice is the historic focus of Ash Wednesday observance and gave the day its name. It is traditional to save the palm branches from the previous Passion/Palm Sunday service and burn them ahead of time to produce the ashes for this service.

This year we are celebrating Ash Wednesday virtually. Each participating member of CFC received a gift bag with various items, including Ashes for the service. There will be an instructed time during the service when you will symbolically place ashes on your forehead.

For individuals who did not receive ashes, they are available in the Church Office during regular business hours.

Ash Wednesday February 17, 2021 at 7 p.m.

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word lencten, which means "spring." The season is a preparation for celebrating Easter. Historically, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by converts and then became a time for penance by all Christians. The First Sunday describes Jesus' temptation by Satan; and the Sixth Sunday (Passion/ Palm Sunday), Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem and his subsequent passion and death. Because Sundays are always little Easters, the penitential spirit of Lent should be tempered with joyful expectation of the Resurrection.

The Great Three Days—sometimes called the Triduum or Pasch—from sunset Holy Thursday through sunset Easter Day are the climax of Lent (and of the whole Christian year) and a bridge into the Easter Season. These days proclaim the paschal mystery of Jesus Christ's passion, death, and resurrection. During these days, the community journeys with Jesus from the upper room, to the cross, to the tomb, and to the garden. They should be seen as a great unified service beginning with a service of Holy Communion on Holy Thursday and concluding with the services of Easter Day. These services may be connected with a prayer vigil lasting from Holy Thursday evening (or Good Friday) until the first service of Easter and may be accompanied by fasting.



Small Group Book Study for LENT

The Way of Forgiveness — Written by the same author of The Way of Blessedness that we studied last fall, The Way of Forgiveness continues the study of Jesus' sermon on the Mount.

It takes a lot of willingness and practice to see life from God's perspective. Perhaps nothing goes more against the grain of human nature than the ideas of forgiving those who wound us and accepting forgiveness from others. The Way of Forgiveness explores how to deal with these issues to preserve "the beauty of our souls" and to fulfill the teachings of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount. In this 9-week study, Thompson breaks down the transformational process by first examining shame, guilt, and anger. A full release of these feelings not



only leads to the wholeness that Christ taught, but also takes us on a path of freedom and joy. A unique feature of this book is the inclusion of a reproduction of Rembrandt's Return of the Prodigal Son. Over the course of the study, the art work will serve as a focal point for reflection and discovery.



CHURCH SCHOOL

Zoom Church School takes place every Sunday from 9:15-9:45. Follow up activities for each lesson were mailed to families at the beginning of the winter quarter and children are invited to use the materials to further their understanding of the day's lesson. We begin each session with a "Follow the Story" Power Point that helps children see the connections between the current story and previous sessions. Seeing and hearing these connections each week supports understanding of both the stories and the passage of time in the Bible.

The birth of Jesus from the Gospel of Luke began the quarter. The Gospel of Mark is the focus of our lessons now. Children are learning about Jesus' ministry: the parables he told, the miracles he performed. Children make connections between the scripture and their own lives and are invited to share those connections with the group.

Vacation Bible School will be held this summer, either in person or via Zoom. Be on the lookout for information about dates and format. In the meantime, be well!

Equipment

- pots (3-5)
- mesh strainer
- small bowls or mason jars

- Natural dye materials (shredded beets, turmeric, etc)
- Filtered water
- 1 2 tbsp vinegar (per dye color)
- eggs (however many you want to make)
- Coconut or olive oil (optional for adding) luster to eggs)

PINK:

2 cups water

2 cups peeled, grated beets 1-2 tablespoons white vinegar

ORANGE:

2 cups yellow onion skins Enough water to cover skins by 1

1-2 tablespoons white vinegar

YELLOW:

2 cups water

1 tablespoon turmeric

2 tablespoons vinegar creates

GREEN or BLUE:

2 cups shredded purple cabbage

Enough water to cover cabbage

by 1 inch

1-2 tablespoons vinegar

PURPLE:

1-2 cups homemade beet kvass - as much as is needed to cover the eggs.

Hello again from the Cotuit Nursery School! A few more children have joined our program since our last update. We currently have 9 students enrolled in our MWF program and 7 in our TTH program. We continue to offer creative, fun learning opportunities to our busy, energetic students in a safe, socially-distanced environment. Some of our annual activities have needed to be modified per government recommendations. For example, our Thanksgiving Feast and our Holiday Parties were held with students and teachers only. Santa paid us a "virtual visit" as he recorded a video at his workshop and emailed it to the school. We posted it on our Facebook page, emailed it to every enrolled family and viewed it during class time.

We created a GoFundMe page to help bridge the budget deficit we have as a result of COVID imposed registration restrictions. We also received some additional donations via mail, including a donation to cover one week of tuition for the entire school!! Our families appreciate this generosity!

In the spring we typically hold a Potluck Dinner and Auction to raise money for the Playground Fund. Cotuit Nursery School maintains the playground that is on the Village Green and will need to weed, rototill and spread a minimum of 20 yards of mulch

in order to be compliant with the Massachusetts Department of Early Education and Care's regulations. Since we are not allowed to hold the Potluck Dinner and Auction in person due to COVID restrictions, we will create a "calendar raffle" instead. We will sell tickets during the month of March and draw a winner each day during the month of April. Donations of prizes are being collected at this time and include items and aift certificates from local businesses. (restaurants, Cape Air, haircuts, Roche Brothers and more!) 
